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## **ABSTRACT**

The main objective of teaching English as a foreign language is to grasp out pragmatic competence. Pragmatic competence can be defined as the speaker's capability to exploit new language properly in a social situation. It is incorporated both illocutionary and sociolinguistic competences simultaneously. The illocutionary competence refers to the speaker's proficiency to fit the utterances meaning with its pragmatic force. Besides, it also concerns on the speaker's competence to apprehend functional aspects of the language.
